

The California State University General Education-Breadth (CSUGE-B) pattern is one option that allows California community college transfer students to fulfill the lower-division general education requirements of any California State University (CSU) campus. The curriculum consists of a 39-unit pattern with five areas of concentration.

For assistance in determining the most appropriate general education pattern, consult a counselor.

AREA A – ENGLISH LANGUAGE COMMUNICATION AND CRITICAL THINKING (Minimum 9 semester units, 12-15 quarter units)

One course from each group

- A1 ORAL COMMUNICATION:** Communication Studies 103, 135*, 170
- A2 WRITTEN COMMUNICATION:** English 101 or 105
- A3 CRITICAL THINKING:** Communication Studies 160; English 205; Philosophy 100, 103*, 205

AREA B – SCIENTIFIC INQUIRY AND QUANTITATIVE REASONING (Minimum 9 semester units, 12-15 quarter units) including:

- One course in B1
- One course in B2
- One of the courses selected to fulfill the requirement for B1 or B2 must include a laboratory component or a separate course must be selected from B3. If a separate laboratory course is selected, it must correspond to one of the two lectures courses selected from B1 or B2.
- One course in B4

CSU UNITED STATES HISTORY, CONSTITUTIONS AND AMERICAN IDEALS

The California State University, before awarding a degree, requires students to complete courses or examinations that address:

1. The historical development of American institutions and ideals (**Area US-1**)
2. The Constitution of the United States and the operation of representative democratic government under that Constitution (**Area US-2**)
3. The process of California state and local government (**Area US-3**)

This requirement may be fulfilled prior to transfer by completing a combination of the courses listed below that satisfies all three areas of the requirement. Courses used to fulfill this requirement may also be used in Area D of the CSUGE-B pattern. Students, who have completed equivalent courses outside the State of California, must complete a course from Area US-3.
