 - A. What are the job projections for San Diego County in the field of Allied Health?
 - 1. The current employment outlook for the Allied Health field is robust.
 - B. How well do Mesa's career-tech programs align with those job projections?
 - 1. All Career/Technical Programs are at the mercy of the job market.
 - 2. All Mesa College Allied Health programs are aligned with other programs in the region and must go through a regional process with the San Diego & Imperial Counties Regional Consortium (SDICCA) and be vetted.
 - 3. Perkins funded programs must show there is a need in the current job market for the program.
 - 4. Occupational Deans always have to look at the job market.
 - C. <u>Are there constraints preventing the expansion of career-tech programs? How much could career-tech programs expand if those constraints were eliminated?</u>
 - 1. All our programs are impacted.
 - 2. Allied Health programs are limited by the number of clinical placement slots available to our students.
 - a. Nine (9) colleges in the region are vying for the limited number of available slots.
 - 3. Mesa College has limited facilities available (Lab Space & Equipment) for the Allied Health programs.
 - 4. We are not only limited by the cost prohibitive nature of obtaining new equipment; we are also limited by the necessary expenses for calibration, inspection, and maintenance of our lab equipment.
 - a. Dean Fritch reported the 13 programs in her school are very expensive to run.
