- A. Miramar College Resolution in Support of Amending the Waiting Period to Retake Assessment and Placement Tests: (Tabled until Falls 2013 pending revisions for MATH.)
 - 1. Terrie Teegarden indicated that students often need to take a math class here, even if they already took it in high school.
 - 2. Terrie said the math department has a challenge process and the review courses which allow student to correct their placement level after doing some review.
 - a. This process is a better way to place students than the current placement test.
 - Both the Miramar and City math departments have agreed that they prefer this way of placing students.
- **B. Resolution 13.4.1 Summers Responsibilities (Hinkes):** (Madeleine Hinkes) 2nd Reading
 - 1. Senate Executive members are available to address important Faculty issues during Summer 2013.
 - a. The first Summer Responsibilities resolution was due to the budget crisis.

- A. Position Paper #2: Curriculum Balance (Competing Visions & Imprecise Data: (John Crocitti)
 - 1. The Academic Affairs Committee met with San Diego Community College District (SDCCD) guest speakers during Fall 2012 and Spring 2013 regarding the topic of Curriculum Balance.
 - a. Campus-Based Researcher Brianna "Bri" Hays will send John the current data this week.
 - Our Curriculum Balance was as follows the last time Academic Affairs reviewed the data:
 - * Transfer = 69%
 - * Basic Skills = 19%
 - * Career Technical Education = 12%
 - Data from Bri will show if the balance has shifted.
 - b. The state of California does not require its 112 community colleges to maintain a certain level of Curriculum Balance.
 - c. Position Paper #2 instructs the committee to review local job projections when reviewing the Curriculum Balance.
 - d. The future of Mesa College's Curriculum Balance will be impacted by the scheduling of Basic Skills courses, Prerequisite courses, and courses our students need to take to fulfill their Education Plans.

- e. The Academic Affairs Committee recommends that Mesa Colleges' Curriculum does <u>not</u> shift at this time.
- f. John's presentation was cut short The Academic Senate ran out of time for the meeting.
