## **Accreditation Recap**

Mesa College welcomed its accreditation team for our site visit, Oct. 11-14, 2010. The visit was led by Dr. Brice Harris, Chancellor, Los Rios Community College District. Team Chair Dr. Brice Harris commended the college for an excellent Self Study; good preparation for the visit and support of the team; the special assistance of selected staff members during the visit and the meals provided by the Culinary Arts program; the evidence files and additional evidence produced at the request of the team; and, the willingness of individuals to talk freely with the team. While the final report and the college's accreditation status will not be made known until after the Commission's January meeting, Dr. Brice did provide a list of areas of commendation and areas of concern which will likely result in recommendations. Instantly, our C-CERT emergency response team, led by Charlotta Robertson and assisted by Officer Diana Medero, swung into action -- as if a real earthquake disaster had occurred. Those in offices heard an instant message regarding what to do in case of an emergency. For the next hour, the C-CERT volunteers set up a Command Center in front of the LRC and dispatched teams to inspect and report on the status of all areas of the campus. The hands-on exercise demonstrated Mesa's amazing team of trained individuals equipped and ready to act immediately.











#### First of its kind: Ethnic Studies Conference

Sparked by the recent passage of Arizona's House Bill 2281 that bans Raza Studies in the Tucson, Arizona school district, the recently formed San Diego Ethnic Studies Consortium held its first regional conference on Ethnic Studies Oct. 1 and 2 at Mesa College. Approximately 500 educators, students and staff from throughout San Diego attended the conference. Conference co-organizers included Mesa Associate Professor Cesar Lopez and Assistant Professor Manuel Velez from Chicano Studies, and Professor Starla Lewis and Associate Professor Thekima Mayasa from Black Studies. Workshops included topics such as the State of SD Ethnic Studies, Critical Race Theory, Faculty Health and Survival, Coalition Building and many others. The conference started Friday evening with opening remarks by representatives from Mesa, UCSD, Palomar, CSUSM and SDSU. Saturday was filled with education workshops and planning for the next steps. Mesa student Angel Beckwith-Malone said, "The best part of the conference was seeing all of the different kinds of people together because unifying and celebrating diversity is what Ethnic Studies represents."

# "Bookstore Boutique" Opens

Just in time for holiday shopping, the "Bookstore Boutique" opens Tuesday, Nov. 2. The unique, cooperative venture between the Mesa College Bookstore and fashion students enrolled in Fashion 110: Fashion Buying and Management offers students a real-world experience in Fashion Merchandising. # **Death Experience Postmortem**

More than 250 students participated in the 2010 Death Experience: Drink, drive, die, sponsored by Student Health Services on Oct. 27. This year was ramped up to be an "in your face" experience. Indeed it was for participants who experienced: making the wrong choice not to accept a cab ride, then (wearing special goggles), the poor coordination of drunk driving; taking a sobriety test from a police officer, being charged and placed under arrest, visiting to a mortuary, meeting the child of a father who had been killed by a drunk driver, and so much more. Stories abounded as students shared their personal experiences and the deaths of loved ones. Student Affairs Dean Ashanti Hands described the event as "moving and we hope, life changing." While 250 students participated, many more were affected, and stopped by displays and vehicles on display, and even to add their personal notes under a Sycamore tree in the Quad. One student wrote: "I lost my car, I lost my job, I lost my home, I even lost my leg. But what I lost most of all was the one I loved."
