New Classroom Tutoring Program Gets Under Way!

Mesa has launched its Classroom Tutoring pilot. The Classroom Tutor Program is an academic assistance program that increases student performance and retention. Funded by our HSI-Title V grant, Classroom Tutors (CTs) provide **free** weekly review sessions to students enrolled in a targeted historically difficult course. CT sessions are interactive review sessions that incorporate course content (what to learn) and study strategies (how to learn). Student attendance is voluntary. The CT Program aims:

- To increase retention within targeted historically difficult courses
- To improve student grades in targeted historically difficult courses
- To increase the graduation rates of students

Mesa currently is piloting the CTs in nine classes (English 43, 47A, 48 and 101, Math 92, and Astronomy 101). For more information please contact the CT coordinators Sim Barhoum or Brad Hughes.


Digital Communications Specialist

On Friday, Sept. 25, San Diego Mesa College launched its new website. The new design features functional and design elements that improve the user experience, especially for students. Highlights include:

- Easy, intuitive navigation
- Expanded academic information pages, which link to the catalog, program

requirements, prerequisites, and class descriptions

- Direct links to student services and campus life pages
- Expanded events calendar
- New campus directory

The project was led by VP Rachelle Agatha, PIO Lina Heil, Web Developer Joel Arias, and the Web Advisory Group: Anabel Pulido, Bri Hayes, Danene Brown, David Fierro, Ginger Davis, Hank Beaver, Karen Owen, Penny Hedgecoth, Sara Beth Cain, Susan Topham, Taj Krumholz, Veronica Gerace, and student Minsun Jung, as well as input from those that filled out surveys, and the nearly 100 program content managers and editors who received training and helped to develop their pages.

After just a few weeks, improvements have been added such as a feedback function on each page to measure and improve user experience. 
