

HONORS GLOBAL COMPETENCIES CERTIFICATE OF ACHIEVEMENT INSTRUCTIONS FOR GRADUATION

In order for students to graduate with the **Certificate of Achievement** for the Honors Global Competencies Certificate (which will place this distinction on transcripts) students will need to do the following:

The student must **Petition to Graduate**. This can be done online, or with a counselor. Students have three opportunities to file their petition.

1. **November 14, 2014**

Deadline for students to file a Petition for Graduation and be a Fall graduate.

2. **March 27, 2015**

Deadline for students to file a Petition for Graduation and be a Spring graduate, and ensure their name will be included in the commencement program.

3. **July 31, 2015**

Deadline for students to file a Petition for Graduation and be a summer graduate.

Meet with a counselor to complete a **Major and Transfer Studies Elective Form**. This District form is necessary for the counselor to complete, to verify which honors classes are being used for the Honors Global Competencies Certificate. Mesa Honors Counselor is Anthony Reuss - areuss@sdccd.edu
