

## THE ARTICULATION PROCESS

### *The Articulation Process Involves*

#### 1. **Baccalaureate Level Credit**

Determining appropriate courses for California State University (CSU) baccalaureate credit and/or course proposals for University of California (UC) transfer consideration. The process for determining baccalaureate credit for a course begins with the Curriculum Process. The official Curriculum Process starts with CurricUNET. Course proposals can include requests for:

- CSU Baccalaureate Credit **and/or**
- UC Transfer Course Agreement (UCTCA) consideration

The curriculum committee(s) and council review all course and program proposals. Final curriculum determinations are made by the District Curriculum and Instructional Council (CIC).

#### 2. **General Education**

Determining appropriate courses to submit to the CSU and UC for transfer general education consideration. Course proposals can include requests for:

- CSU General Education-Breadth (CSUGE-B) pattern **and/or**
- Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC) pattern

The curriculum committee(s) and council review all course and program proposals. Final curriculum determinations are made by the District Curriculum and Instructional Council (CIC).

#### 3. **Articulation Agreements with the CSU and UC**

Establishing, updating and maintaining articulation agreements with the CSU and UC campuses (*i.e.—course-to-course agreements*). With the exception of San Diego State University (SDSU), articulation agreements are established throughout the year. The submission cycle for SDSU occurs once per year.

#### 4. **Articulation Agreements and Transfer Guides with Independent/Private Colleges/Universities**

Establishing, updating and maintaining articulation agreements and transfer guides with independent and private colleges and universities. Articulation agreements and transfer guides are established throughout the year.
