



GUIDELINES FOR ESTABLISHING AN AGREEMENT WITH SAN DIEGO MESA COLLEGE

San Diego Mesa is one of three colleges of the San Diego Community College District. San Diego Mesa College is accredited by the Accrediting Commission for Community and Junior Colleges of the Western Association of Schools and Colleges, an institutional accrediting body recognized by the Council for Higher Education and the U.S. Department of Education.

The San Diego Mesa Articulation Office will establish articulation agreements with institutions that are accredited by one of the following regional institutional accrediting organizations:

- Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools, Commission on Higher Education (MSA-CHE)
- Northwest Commission of Colleges and Universities (NWCCU)
- North Central Association of Colleges and Schools, The Higher Learning Commission (NCA-HLC)
- New England Association of Schools and Colleges, Commission on Institutions of Higher Education (NEASC-CIHE)
- New England Association of Schools and Colleges, Commission on Technical and Career Institutions (NEASC-CTCI)
- Southern Association of Colleges and Schools, Commission on Colleges (SACS)
- Western Association of Schools and Colleges, Accrediting Commission for Community and Junior Colleges (WASC-ACCJC)
- Western Association of Schools and Colleges, Accrediting Commission for Senior Colleges and Universities (WASC-ACSCU)

The following information may be useful when preparing articulation proposals:

1. Inclusive Dates (Required)

The academic year of the agreement.

Note: The academic year for the San Diego Community College District starts with the fall semester and it ends with the summer session.

2. College/University Headings (Required)

This will allow students to determine which college/university courses/requirements are applicable to, and the agreement type (major or general education).

3. General Education (Recommended)

If your college or university accepts the California State University General Education-Breadth (CSUGE-B) and/or the Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC) in meeting lower division general education requirements, it would be helpful to include such information on the agreement.

4. Disclaimer Statement (Required)

Should a student return to Mesa from your institution, this statement indicates that the agreement is for transfer and that the application of credit is for use **from** Mesa **to** your institution only.

5. Signature Page (Required)

The following information should appear on the signature page

- a. The agreement inclusive dates
- b. Signature lines and dates
- c. Printed name of officials
- d. Title of officials
- e. Name of the college(s) and/or university

Note: The information should appear for both institutions. Once the agreement has been reviewed and approved, two (2) signature pages will be sent to you (by snail mail), with a request to return one of the completed signature pages for my records.

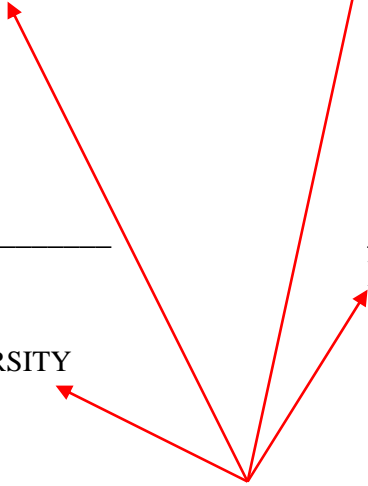

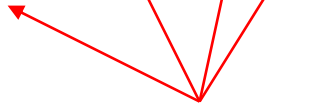
