

## Mesa's Factuar, IVC's Gonzalez tabbed by PCC

The Pacific Coast Conference has selected San Diego Mesa College volleyball player Alyssa Factuar and Imperial Valley soccer player Alice Gonzalez as Women's Athletes of the Week for the week that ended Sunday.

Factuar, a sophomore setter from Bonita Vista High School, recorded 258 assists as the Olympians played five matches (18 games) in three days, winning four of them.

Factuar had 40 assists as Mesa defeated San Joaquin Delta in three games. Factuar came back with 43 assists, two aces and a solo block in a victory over San Bernardino Valley. She recorded 50 assists and four blocks in a loss to El Camino. Factuar contributed 60 assists and two blocks in a win over Palomar. And she helped lift Mesa to a victory over Moorpark with 60 assists, 21 digs and two blocks.

Gonzalez, a freshman from Calexico High School, keyed the Arabs' 6-0 win over MiraCosta by scoring three goals.

Honorable mention for the week went to Southwestern cross country runner Karia Antecio, Grossmont water polo player Sarah Bentley, Cuyamaca soccer players Caroline Margulis and Nichole Bishop, and San Diego City College soccer player Laura Reyes.

Antecio, a freshman from Hilltop High School, placed third in the Orange Coast Classic at Fairview Park in Costa Mesa, running the 5-kilometer course in 20:19.90. She was the first Pacific Coast Conference finisher in the 87-runner field.

Bentley, a freshman 2-meter player attacker from Centennial High School in Corona, scored two goals as the Olympians downed Grossmont in a PCC game 7-5. She also tallied eight goals at the Mt. SAC Tournament as she helped lead the Griffins to wins over Rio Hondo (17-4), El Camino (14-0) and Saddleback (20-9).

Margulis, sophomore forward from Granite Hills High School, scored the only goal of the game as the Coyotes defeated district rival Grossmont 1-0. Earlier in the week, she contributed a goal and two assists to help Cuyamaca beat Imperial Valley.

Bishop, a freshman goalkeeper from Mar Vista High School, recorded a shutout in the victory over Grossmont. The shutout was Bishop's third of the season.

Reyes, a sophomore forward from Hoover High School, scored two goals in a 5-0 victory over MiraCosta. She also helped key a second-half comeback attempt in a loss to San Diego Miramar, putting away two penalty kicks.
