- May 4, 2011
 - Action Items
 - Reviewed & approved last meeting minutes.
 - Information Items
 - Budget, we will know more after the May 16th revise, the state \$3 billion more than thought, so things are improving. It looks as though we are still looking at an all cuts budget. There is talk of “deals in the works” with some of the conservatives, but costs may be too high (demands so far are pension reform, more cuts...)
 - Review of manual 3200 re: procedures and operating guidelines for student clubs and organizations. No substance change other than adding travel advisors, and rights to deny names of clubs if inappropriate...Students (who were most effected in this) were in full support of manual 3200 .
 - SDICCCA Grant proposal (America Graduates Bill) discussion, concerns from faculty primarily regarding work load changes. Effects healthcare and automotive technology programs primarily.
 - Student Parking Permit Fee increase, heated discussion, mostly opposed. Although student pay \$35 per semester, in other cc’s it is mostly \$40. In summer other cc’s cut the cost in half, SDCCD does not. We also charge more than double what other cc’s charge for daily parking. Request was made to see parking budget which is currently \$112,000 in the red. Discussion regarding charging staff and faculty for permits like CSU and UC. No area community colleges charge staff and faculty for parking. Tabled.
 - Roundtable: Watkins asked about Job flier, why district can hire external (such as the Sr. Clerical Assistant position), but campus must hire from within. Will Surbrook answered that it was due to a lack of internal applicants the first time around.
