A packed house filled the Apolliad Theatre for a stunning flamenco dance and music “cuadro” performance at Mesa College on Oct. 12th. The brainchild of Spanish Professor **Dora Schoenbrun-Fernández**, “Flamenco Culture & Art Form,” was a showcase of teaching and learning that stepped outside the confines of the traditional classroom directly into the heart, mind and soul. Perfect lighting set the mood as the history and performance of flamenco was brought to life by **Rocio Carrera** (baile, stage name Paloma Aragon), accompanied by **Oscar Aragon** (guitarra) and **Emilia Eneva** (cante). The highly charged performance was underscored by chants of “Aupa!” from an enraptured audience of students, faculty, staff and guests. “This culturally enriching event provided curriculum enhancement in a variety of Humanities courses,” said Prof. Schoenbrun-Fernández, “It was a celebration of artistic, social and cultural diversity.” Aupa!

Mesa Music... Showcased at Dizzy's



The Mesa College Music Department showcased its performer professors on Oct. 19 at San Diego's hottest hotspot, **Dizzy's**, located in the San Diego Wine and Culinary Center at Harbor Club Towers. "Mesa Night" featured the **Mesa College Big Band**, under the direction of **James Romeo**, the **Mesa College Vocal Ensemble**, and an ensemble made up of instructors including **George Svoboda**, **Jaeryoung Lee**, **Jim Romeo**, and **Bob Boss**. The ensemble also played a composition by the Music Department's own **Momilani Ramstrum**.

Speech and Debate Team Debut – No debate about it, the Olympian Speech and Debate Team is off to a stellar start. In early October, the Olympians scored in its first event at Concordia University, where they competed against 97 debate teams and 413 speeches, including some of the best programs in the nation.

Andrew James took first place in both Novice Informative speaking, Novice Extemporaneous speaking, and 8th place in Junior Parliamentary Debate. Other category placements included Novice Extemporaneous speaking (**Devin Darcy**), Novice Parliamentary Debate Octo- Finals (**Jalessa Johnson** and **Erika Gasca**); Novice Parliamentary (**Erika Gasca**); and Junior Parliamentary Debate: (**Andrew James** and **Brittany Boiko**). The team also did well at the Oct. 28, Point Loma Nazarene non-official parliamentary debate tournament. Two Olympians placed 2nd (**Brandon Delavar**) and 8th (**Jose Caballero III**) in speaker awards. Two debate teams (**Brandon Delavar** and **Jose Caballero III**; and **Brigitte Miller**, **Owen Garcia**, and **Bobby Whaley III**) took Bronze Awards. Profs. **Kim (Gerhardt) Perigo** and **Linda Farnan** report, "Our team is very new this year and we were excited to launch them into their first tournament and they made us all proud!"

Great California Shakeout

At exactly 10:21 a.m. on Oct.21, the Mesa College community "dropped, covered, and held on." Instantly, our C-CERT emergency response team, led by **Charlotta Robertson** and assisted by Officer **Diana Medero**, swung into action -- as if a real earthquake disaster had occurred. Those in offices heard an instant message regarding what to do in case of an emergency. For the next hour, the C-CERT volunteers set up a Command Center in front of the LRC and dispatched teams to inspect and report on the status of all areas of the campus. The hands-on exercise demonstrated Mesa's amazing team of trained individuals equipped and ready to act immediately.



Death Experience Postmortem

A record number of 400 students participated in the 2011 Death Experience, located in front of the LRC on Oct. 26th. The annual event is sponsored by Student Health Services as part of National Collegiate Alcohol



Awareness Week. Crashed cars framed the multiple experiences of simulated drunk driving; an arrest and booking; accident scene with crashed car; emergency first-responders who used the jaws of life to extract the victim; and a funeral complete with casket and mourners.

On-Track with the Olympians!

Once a week, student-athletes are nominated by their coaches, for the “Pacific Coast Athletic Conference Athlete of the Week Award.” This award is given to a female and a male student-athlete who is selected from a pool of candidates from all nine participating colleges. This fall season, 11 of Mesa’s student-athletes have been honored as “PCAC Athlete of the Week,” with others making the Honorable Mention list. Women’s Volleyball has taken the PCAC conference by storm and moved into first place as they beat nationally ranked Grossmont College and a tough Palomar College squad. With half of the season ahead, they have plenty of time to secure their position in the PCAC. Hot on the winning trail is the Mesa Women’s Soccer team, which has only lost one conference game and two in the entire season. The team has been playing some very intense ball and has only given up five goals in PCAC play and moved up to #8 ranking in the state. The Men’s team has also been holding at 3rd Place in the conference and has plenty of time in the season to move up following a great victory over City College. At last week’s **PCAC Cross Country Championships**, the Men’s team surged past top ranked Southwestern and had runners finish 1st, 2nd, 4th, 5th, 6th, and 7th giving the team the championship title. **Dylan Marx**, who placed 1st, was named the PCAC Championship runner. The women’s cross country did well taking 3rd at the same championship and are a strong contender at the SoCal Championships. The Olympian football team took visiting San Bernardino Valley College by surprise and won their final home game 21-10. Their outstanding defense kept the Wolverines scoreless after the 3rd quarter and helped the offense score an unanswered 11 points to secure the victory.

Passings:

Coach Charlie Popa, a longtime Mesa College faculty member and football coach, passed away on Oct. 14, 2011. Coach Popa was always interested and involved with his students, football athletes and colleagues. He joined Mesa College in 1964 where he taught physical education and coached football until his retirement in 1996. He came to Mesa from San Diego High School where he was a teacher and assistant football coach from 1957 to 1960, and head football coach in 1961. His specialty and love was teaching the Physical Education in the Elementary Schools class. After retirement, Coach Popa enjoyed attending many of the Mesa College Football games and the annual Department Golf Tournament.



Joyce Skaryak, one of Mesa's most well-known and respected classified staff members, passed on Oct. 17, 2011, following a brief illness. Joyce joined the Mesa College staff in 1974. She most recently held the position of Secretary, Learning Resources & Instructional Support. In 37 years of service to the college and the District, Joyce will be probably best remembered as Classified Senate President, an elected position she held for many years. Joyce was an advocate of shared governance who worked tirelessly to see that the contributions of classified staff members were not only recognized, but that the group had a voice in college- and district-wide matters. Projects she championed included numerous LRC book sales, the Hurricane Katrina fundraiser, a cookbook fundraiser, and the United Way Campaign. Under her leadership, the Classified Senate holiday shopping bazaar at the San Diego Center

for Children brought smiles to needy children, and raised more than \$12,000 through the years. Joyce also worked to provide scholarships for students who might otherwise not have the financial resources to go to school. "It is difficult to imagine a Mesa without Joyce," noted President Pamela Luster. The statement was echoed by many. Donations to the family may be made through **Cindy Hess**, x2692.
