Dear Student:

You have indicated on your 2016 - 2017 Free Application for Federal Student Aid [FAFSA] that you have or will have a bachelor's degree by July 1, 2016 **or** that you will be a Graduate/Professional student during the 2016 – 2017 academic year.

Before we can continue processing your application the Financial Aid office will need clarification, as having a Bachelor's Degree will disqualify a student from receiving aid based on the Standards of Academic Progress and federal regulations. Also, at San Diego Mesa College there are no graduate programs.

Please visit the San Diego Mesa College Financial Aid Office during regular business hours with a written statement regarding your status or fax a statement directly to the office at (619) 388-2824 so that a Financial Aid staff member can determine what corrections, if any, may be needed.

If you do have your Bachelor's Degree completed you are disqualified from receiving aid with the exception of the Board of Governor's Enrollment Fee Waiver [BOGW] for California residents who qualify.
