ELIGIBILITY:

If you are just starting college: High School GPA of 3.5; or a 3.00 with two letters of recommendation from teachers / counselors who know your work; or qualifying scores on our own college placement test.

If you have previous college-level work: An overall GPA of 3.25 in 12 units or more, or a 3.50 GPA in all previous coursework in the same subject area.
