CSU GENERAL EDUCATION BREADTH REQUIREMENTS – CERTIFICATION PATTERN

General Education (GE) consists of courses selected from a variety of disciplines, intended to provide a well-rounded education. Completing a GE pattern is one of the recommended components for transfer to any CSU. Other required transfer components include grade point average and preparation for the major coursework. Courses listed in more than one area cannot be certified in multiple areas. Please visit the Transfer Center or Counseling office to obtain all the requirements for transfer to a CSU.

Depending on intended campus of transfer, students may be eligible for transfer to California State Universities upon completion of 60 transferable semester units with a grade point average of 2.0 ("C") or better. A total of 60 units are recommended for transfer with junior standing.

GOLDEN FOUR: Areas – A1, A2, A3 and B4 are required for admission into any CSU. P/NP grades are **not** recommended in these Areas, as many CSU campuses require letter grades of "C" or better for graduation.

GENERAL EDUCATION CERTIFICATION:

- Certification of General Education courses is requested when the CSU GE pattern has been completed and students have been accepted to a CSU campus. Prior to GE certification, students must complete a minimum of 12 units in residence at the SDCCD colleges, or 3 units of general education transferable course work from the CSU Certification Pattern.
- Official transcripts from all other accredited institutions attended must be on file and will be reviewed for inclusion in the certification process. A minimum of 39 semester units is required for a **complete** certification.

Advanced Placement Exams: acceptable scores of 3, 4, or 5 can be used to satisfy many CSUGE subject areas. Only one Advanced Placement course per area may be used to fulfill CSUGE requirements.
