INTERSEGMENTAL GENERAL EDUCATION TRANSFER CURRICULUM REQUIREMENTS 2024-2025

The Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC) pattern allows California Community College students to fulfill the lower-division general education requirements of the California State University and most University of California campuses prior to transfer. The curriculum consists of a 37-unit pattern with seven areas of concentration. *Courses listed in multiple areas shall be certified in one area. Exception: courses in Languages Other Than English can be certified in Areas 3B and 6A. +Transfer credit may be limited by either the CSU or UC. Please consult with a counselor for additional information.

Area 1 English Communication Minimum 6-9 semester units.

CSU requirement, one course from each group. UC requirement, one course each from Group 1A and 1B.
