Agenda Item D: Roundtable

DISCUSSION	<p>DOC Presentations</p> <p><i>Raul Rodriguez (Puente Program):</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Puente program is a learning community for our students for English and Personal Growth classes. It is unique because those classes come from a Chicana/o perspective for our Latino students. Most of our students are first-generation college students. Our goal is to help underrepresented students transfer to a four year institution. We aid them to understand the transfer process. We emphasize the importance of <i>familia</i>. Assessment Tools: “Who am I?” “Where do I want to go?” “How will I get there?” <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Rodriguez discussed the results of the action plan for the Puente program. Students fear public speaking, but this helps their development and personal growth. This year they focused on critical thinking CLO. In the fall they assessed 25 courses. For those courses that overlap, they will evaluate those CLOs together. The target is 70% of students reaching competency in total. Duckles presented clear data about the assessment results. The mapping was completed of the CLOs to the ILOs and PLOs into Taskstream. <p><i>Erika Higginbotham (DSPS):</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> DSPS is not a program. They do not have a cohort. They also have an instructional component. DSPS focused on three student outcomes for the year. For the instructional courses, they have identified two CLOs. The department met in January and they decided how to assess. They decided on the rubric and they chose to use a survey to assess the students. In terms of the future, the terminology that they utilize may not be the same way that the students interpret the terminology. DSPS team discussed how to engage students at the beginning. They are looking to add accommodation forms that they give their professors. Monica Demcho (EOPS):

- Our program is a retention program. We focus on transfer.
- Students who are part of the program are required to see the staff at least three times during the semester to keep them engaged. We make those program expectations to keep track of the students as well.
- They developed a student handbook with the program expectations that each student receives at each EOPS program orientation.
- The changes they've implemented in the assessments have been working.
- EOPS is using both a qualitative and quantitative method to assess their students.

Leroy Johnson (Transfer Center):

- They have 7 student service outcomes that they are assessing.
- The Transfer Center aims to support the students by offering workshops to help them understand the university online application process.
- The transfer center uses surveys to conduct assessments. They want to keep the assessment short for every workshop they offer because they know students are busy.
- Johnson provided typical questions that are made available on the surveys. They look for 80% of accuracy from the students and aim to increase the understanding of the online application process.
- Throughout summer 2016 and now to spring 2017 they have assessed the students.
- The department discussed the survey and the student responses. They like the open-ended responses. They use this information in our Program Review as well.
- The current action plan is to improve the breakdown of the survey methods to gather data.
- They need additional resources to assist them with the comparative data.
- The continuing goal is to upgrade the software package they currently have in order to get best results of the data.

Marichu Magana (STAR TRIO):

- Their goal for students is to graduate and transfer within a four year timeframe.
- Each staff member and counselor takes on an assessment question to review our students.
- STAR TRIO has a space in front of the office and club for student engagement and interaction.
- They focus a lot on students to utilize the resources they have available in the program. Their discussion is centered around those students who do not come to the center. They are spending time on trying to think about everything that they do and figure out a way to get those students. The student outcomes for graduation and persistence are high, but what about those students that are falling through the cracks? They are currently collecting data on that.

Dina Miyoshi (Behavioral Sciences):

- They met in January during the FLEX event. They revised all of their course outcomes. They also worked on their course mapping during this meeting.
- Miyoshi will get that information to Charlie Lieu within the next month.
- They are trying to move closer to focus on Psych 101. They average 30-40 sections and serve more than 1500 students over the course of a semester.
