For the past 6 months I have been co-chairing the [CEOCCC Affordability, Food and Housing Task Force](#). We have already published our draft [recommendations](#), and some are making their way into new legislation. We are excited to advocate for two years of free community college & the expansion of financial aid through Santiago AB2, (Promise) and Leyva [SB291](#). Next week on March 7 I will join Assembly Member Jose Medina, Chancellor Oakley, Sara Goldrick-Rab of the [Hope Center at Temple University](#), and my colleague Keith Curry, Compton College President, at the briefing on the outcomes of the first CCC Basic Needs Survey. Stay tuned as we expand our own efforts to address basic needs on campus.

On Friday, February 22, Mesa hosted the LIT Conference, a special conference for faculty, staff, and students, designed to encourage foster youth to pursue educational goals and become innovative thinkers, and to inspire foster youth supporters to become innovative leaders and provide unique space for foster youth empowerment. Keynote speakers included Kevinee Gilmore, a former foster youth from Cleveland who shared how she started a movement, #FosterCare, with only \$15. With support from Rock & Roll Hall of Famer Darryl "DMC" McDaniels, former presidential candidate Hillary Clinton, and rapper Shawn "JAY Z" Carter, Gilmore was able to take the movement nationwide. After leadership workshops, the final keynote speaker, David Shands, discussed how students can take control of their lives despite hardships. I would like to offer a special note of gratitude to Sade Burrell, Counselor and FAST Scholars Program Coordinator, and all of the staff involved in hosting this event that truly displayed Mesa's commitment to equity and excellence.

The facility includes an art history lecture room; studios for drawing, digital graphics, sculpture, ceramics, and painting; and workshop spaces to support the shared use of art equipment, material, and supply resources. The new facility provides an environment that is responsive to student needs and industry trends, and was carefully designed in ways to encourage creativity and inspiration, and to best showcase student outcomes and artistic engagement with the community.



Mesa's New Art Gallery

The [Mesa College Art Gallery](#) kicked off an exciting spring semester with its first exhibit in the newly remodeled Fine Arts Building. The inaugural exhibition, *Looking Forward, Looking Back*, featured the work of 47 alumni
