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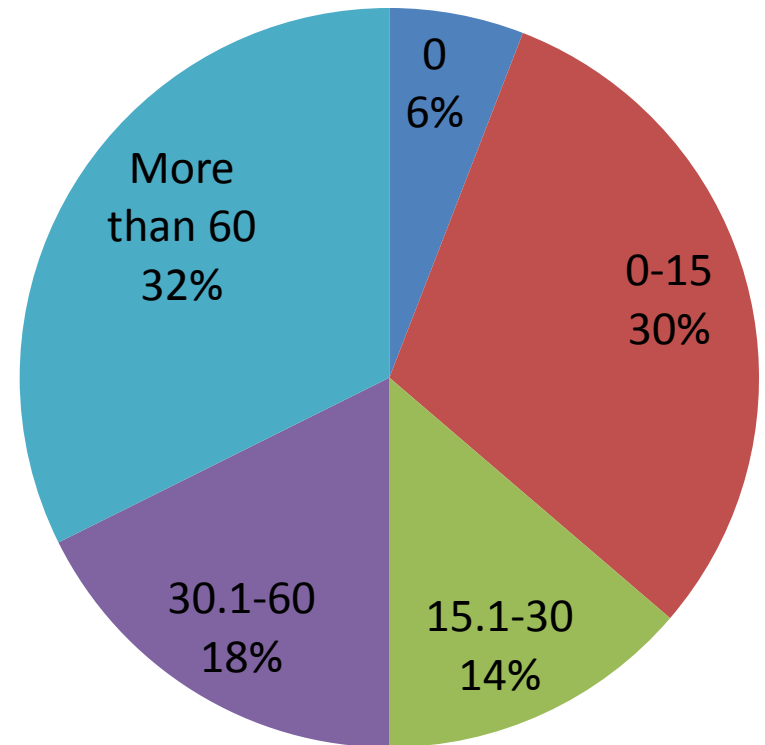

# Did not Persist

- Demographic characteristics closely matched with the demographics of the overall 2016/17 student body
- 57% indicated degree, transfer, or certificate as their Ed. Goal



# Persist

- Over 2,000 students who were enrolled at Mesa in Spring 2017 and returned to Mesa in Fall 2017 are also enrolled at either City or Miramar in Fall 2017.
- Students who are enrolled at both Mesa and another credit college are attempting more units on average (11.48) than those who are only enrolled at Mesa College (9.24).
