**III. Welcome and Introductions:**

**IV. Retreat Debrief:**

Marisa shared that the MPC retreat was a success. Feedback from the retreat was collected, will be transcribed and be available as a living document to be utilized in workgroups and project teams. The first half of the retreat was focused on culture and leadership. The second part, Dr. Al provided helpful tools that will assist in carrying the work forward. The spreadsheet that was utilized was shared with examples of what the workgroups and project teams had to work with. In the coming week, the leads will be receiving the feedback that was collected at the retreat. For the new funding it is requested for the leads to make sure the work plan is accurate.

**V. Student Success Teams Summer Updates and Fall Planning:**

Ian shared that the pilot was launched and the initial cohort of 57, first year disadvantaged students (non-white), not enrolled in English/Math, and with no associates or higher degree were selected. Students in the experimental group will get the Success Team interventions, students in the Control group will get standard material. Students were encourage through email so that they enroll in transfer level English/math and to enroll in twelve units. Each member of the Student Success team had between ten to thirteen students and keeping track of the contacted students on an internal form. A template is used to email students, but it is customizable. Students will be contacted biweekly. The next communication that will be sent will be to encourage students to visit the Career and Transfer Center. Before the second 8 weeks and before spring enrollment begins, an email will be sent to motivate students to enroll in English/math and to enroll in at least twelve units. We will be keeping track of data and by the end or beginning of the semester data will be available.

It was mentioned that the PR Group found that nearly half of the students would like to be contacted in such things as enrollment, more flexibility to balance work and personal life. 31% need to prioritize work, 12% need to prioritize care of a dependent, 21% not

enough distance education available. Reason for dropping: 33% prioritize their work, 31% prioritize their mental health and wellbeing, 29% could not keep up with the class pace. This committee meets every first and third Wednesday from 4-5 pm. It was shared that Constant Contact and a Remind Me app. are available to help with contacting students. Before the policy was waved in 2022, students were notified that they were going to be dropped for nonpayment, it was discovered that students did not know about the services that are offered to them. 4,500 students will be contacted by September.

#### **VI. Data Coaches Summer Update and Fall Planning:**

Gina shared that the program will be launching next week. The Canvas Shell is setup with a mix of synchronous and asynchronous materials, the goal is to train beginning this semester and might be a yearlong training based on basics of statistics, data analysis and how to present data. Compensation will be: One ESU for faculty and OT/release time for Classified.

Marisa shared that in the next meeting and/or will be sending out an email for everyone to have an opportunity to vote on either holding the meetings through Zoom or in person.
