

## UC Berkeley STEM Major Splitting sequences update for Fall 2022 Transfer

If you are applying to UC Berkeley with a STEM major for the Fall of 2022 please check out this information.

If you took a science sequence and split the courses between City, Mesa or Miramar there are some majors that will not accept some major prep courses when the sequence is completed at different schools within our district. See courses effected below:

### Impacted sequences

- Biol 210A & 210B (both courses should be taken at the SAME campus)
- Chem 200+L & 201+L (all courses should be taken at the SAME campus)
- Chem 231+L & 233+L (all courses should be taken at the SAME campus)
- Phys 180A+181A & 180B+181B (all courses should be taken at the SAME campus)
- Phys 195 & 196 & 197 (all courses should be taken at the SAME campus)

### Sequences NOT impacted

- Math 150 & 151 & 252 & beyond (each class may be taken at any SDCCD campus)
- Econ 120 & 121 (each class may be taken at any SDCCD campus)
